Pharmacy Options Explanations

HealthPass offers many Rx options. The chart below will help you better understand your Rx benefits. For the applicable formulary list visit your carrier's website.

Rx Definitions:

Generic - Generic drugs are ones which no longer have, or never had, patent protection and are generally referred to by their chemical names.

Brand Name - Brand name drugs may still have patent protection so they can only be produced by the creating pharmaceutical company or those companies licensed by the creating company.

Non-Preferred Brand - Drugs are generally placed on the non-preferred list only when there is a preferred drug that offers the same therapeutic benefit or there is an approved generic available.

	Each member must first satisfy a \$50 pharmacy deductible (per calendar year). The deductible is applicable to each member and each dependent separately. After the deductible is satisfied, drugs continue to be purchased at the copay levels. (This benefit is capped at an amount payable by the carrier of \$2,000 per member per calendar year.)		
No Rx	Members will be responsible for 100% of the pharmacy charges. Diabetics covered by the New York State diabetic mandate should consult their chosen carrier's certificate of coverage for insulin and diabetic supply benefits. Discount card available through Sun Rx.

Drugs at the pharmacy are dispensed for a 30 day supply or 120 dosages, whichever is the lesser of the two. Some drugs may require prior authorization and/or be subject to dispensing limitations.




***GHI Mandatory Mail Order** - GHI members receive one 30 day prescription and one 30 day refill through a retail pharmacy. After that, all maintenance medication must be filled through the MANDATORY mail order process of Medco Rx Services.
